Executive Summary

THE EQUITY ALLIANCE (TEA) is committed to liberating Black communities across the state of Tennessee and beyond. This call to action has been amplified by the repeated horrific events that have plagued communities of color for far too long. TEA realizes that much more must be done. Therefore, a targeted reparations policy agenda for Black Tennesseans is no longer an option, but rather a necessity. The lack of representation and also misrepresentation in the areas of education, housing, criminal justice/public safety, health care, economic opportunity, and politics/democracy will be the focus of the organization's strategies to disrupt oppressive structures and systems by building alliances to dismantle them one-by-one.

After a year of extreme growth for TEA following its inception in November 2016, **THE EQUITY ALLIANCE** Board of Directors, Co-Founders/Co-Executive Directors, and the team present an inaugural strategic plan. This framework will guide the work of the organization over the next three years. All the voices heard via different modes throughout 2020, from the Our Fair Share survey in partnership with Nashville Mayor John Cooper, volunteers, trusted partners, supporters, staff, the Board, and the Co-Founders/Co-Executive Directors, are threaded throughout the pages that follow.

Our Mission


THE EQUITY ALLIANCE unapologetically builds independent Black political and economic power. We educate, empower, and mobilize Black people to take action and keep our government in check.

Our approach is unapologetic in order to build the independent political and economic power Black people deserve for creating the quality of life we want.

Our Goals

Our efforts are focused across the goal areas of **Democracy, Growth,** and **Power**, which is grounded in our dedication to improving the Quality of Life for Black people. The expected outcomes for our communities intersect larger national areas including health disparities, affordable housing, safe neighborhoods, equitable educational opportunities, economic well-being, and justice for our people.



Our mission

of building independent Black political and economic power by educating, empowering, and mobilizing Black people to take action and keep our government in check will be met.

The Power Pillars

provide further guidance around how we execute programming, campaigns, and operational enhancements in a way that empowers and uplifts Black communities to create change.



By moving on each Call to Action

below we align our programming strategies to reach these objectives for benefitting Black families within and outside of the state of Tennessee.



- Increase TEAs Black voter registration roster by 80,000 annually, reducing the 55% gap between Black (20%) vs. white (75%) registrants in TN.
- Achieve 5% annual growth in Black voter turnout narrowing the 40% gap between Black (10%) vs. white (50%) registered voters in TN showing up to vote.
- Expand access to the ballot by producing a minimum of 2 democracy reforms by 2024.



- Build 6 fully staffed alliances (TEA chapters) across TN by 2024 and 2 more by 2026 in the deep South region.
- Establish a \$1M annual revenue stream decreasing reliability on foundations by 2024.

Power:

- Increase the participation rate of a growing volunteer and partnership base who engages in at least 2 TEA campaigns and/or action programming annually.
- Grow the number of Black Tennesseans appointed, hired, recruited, and elected to positions of power for change because of TEA's support and/or leadership development.

Then the communities we serve will experience our vision of a world where Black communities are thriving and have equitable access to power, resources, and the freedom to choose their quality of life.

Quality of Life

The BlackPrint Agenda

Amplifying past and present inequities through focused policy agenda work will be key. Improvements would minimally be expected across **national measures** such as:

- Health: 13.8% of Black or African American people of all ages are in fair or poor health.¹
- **Employment:** 17.4% unemployment rate for African American workers.⁴
- **Housing:** African Americans make up 40% of the homeless population even though they are only 13% of the general population.²
- Justice: Perceptions and reality shifted
 87% of Black adults see U.S. criminal
 justice system as more unjust towards
 Black people; 61% of white adults agree.⁵
- **Education:** 75 out of 100 Black students perform below reading proficiency on a national assessment.³

Our **Objectives** provide deeper clarity around what each goal statement means in measurable terms. As an organization, we want to see these measures moving in the right direction. If not, we will use data to inform adjustments to how we are approaching the work.



Democracy

Reshaping democracy to work for us.

- Increase TEA's Black voter registration roster by 80,000 annually, reducing the 55% gap between Black (20%) vs. white (75%) registrants in TN.




THE EQUITY ALLIANCE'S vision statement is depicted by the upper portion of the pyramid and is restated here:

Our Programming Strategies

The success of the overall strategic plan will be supported by holding ourselves accountable for regular progress monitoring and reporting out to the community about how each programming strategy is helping **THE EQUITY ALLIANCE** achieve its measurable objectives and related goals. The **Programming Strategies** are briefly described below:

The BlackPrint Agenda	A reparations policy publication to illuminate issues impacting the Quality of Life within the communities we serve and provide a platform to celebrate wins in the democracy space, growth in the movement, and the building of independent black political power through our people.
Democracy Hub	A programming strategy to ensure fair and equitable redistricting in our communities and expanding ballot access by passing rights restoration legislation to repeal legal financial obligations.
TN Black Voter Project	A programming strategy to increase civic engagement and voter participation in Black communities in Tennessee.
Capital Campaign	A programming strategy to raise capital for funding the purchase of land and a building for offce space, social enterprise, and workforce development.
TEA State License Plate	A programming strategy to design and launch a state license plate to produce revenue for programming, operational stability, and increase our presence to deepen support.
Pledge 21	A programming strategy to build alliances which extend the impact of our efforts for Black families beyond the state of Tennessee.
National Exposure & Partnerships	A programming strategy using relational organizing and various communication channels to retain current donors and solicit new commitments of support.
TEA Alliances	A programming strategy to grow our network of equity partners.
Black Women & Men for TN	A programming strategy to build a coalition of Black women and men leaders to engage their networks and communities in THE EQUITY ALLIANCE movement.
#DontSellOutNorf	A programming strategy to keep Black homeowners in their homes mitigating foreclosures resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, encouraging homeownership and generational wealth, and to love on our people by providing economic relief.
The Plugin	A programming strategy to list build around BlackPrint issue areas, increase statewide presence, and educating the community on how to plug in (build power).
Community Mobilizers	A programming strategy to conduct canvassing and community outreach activities that will capture the voices and opinions of Black Tennesseans in targeted districts.
LiberTEA Collective	A programming strategy to create a statewide talent pipeline for the next generation of civic leaders and democracy defenders in Tennessee.
